Born in India (1954), he obtained his PhD in Philosophy from Julius Maximilian University , Germany and was Professor of Goa Institute of Management. He is now a commissioned writer for the department Advanced Studies in Business Management of Oxford University Press and has authored ten books so far.

He is founder and president of Seat of Wisdom Educational Society, which runs programmes in higher professional education, providing wide range of consulting services whose main thrust is executive training, environmental management and industrial safety.

He continues to be the advisor to the former Chief Minister who is presently the Vice Chairman of the Planning Board (Cabinet Minister) of Goa and consultant to TARU Environment Research Consultants, Delhi & Hyderabad and to Biodiversity Conservation India Ltd. (BCIL), Bangalore whose project on environmental model for sustainable cities won an award in Tokyo in 2003.
